

Report

As the sending organisation, we are pleased to report the successful participation of nine young people from Armenia in the DIGISC Youth Exchange in Pissouri, Cyprus. Through workshops, intercultural activities, and collaborative group work, participants developed practical skills in digital storytelling and explored how creative media can be used to raise awareness of social issues and encourage positive change.

Participant feedback confirms that the project achieved its objectives. They gained new knowledge in digital content creation, visual communication, and storytelling while improving their confidence, teamwork, communication, and intercultural competences. Many highlighted that the experience strengthened their understanding of responsible digital media, the importance of authentic storytelling, and the value of empathy and collaboration. They also expressed pride in representing Armenia, sharing their culture, and learning from participants from different countries, resulting in greater cultural awareness and lasting international friendships.

Following the mobility, the Armenian participants successfully organized six follow-up dissemination activities across Shirak, Ararat, Tavush (Dilijan), and local schools and youth centres. Together, they reached more than 100 young people from over seven communities through interactive workshops and information sessions. Participants shared the outcomes of the DIGISC project, introduced digital storytelling as a tool for civic engagement and social change, and promoted Erasmus+ opportunities by providing practical guidance on international youth mobility.

Overall, the project created a sustainable impact by equipping participants with valuable digital, social, and intercultural competences while inspiring them to transfer their knowledge to their local communities. The follow-up activities significantly extended the project's reach and encouraged more young people in Armenia to become active, internationally engaged, and confident in using digital storytelling to create positive social impact.
