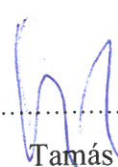
We joined this project because we wished to contribute to measures and initiatives that have the potential to develop the overall quality and effectiveness of youth work. We consider the media literacy and the responsible digital communication of young people to be one of the most important responsibilities of youth organisations today, as young people spend an increasing part of their lives in digital spaces where stereotypes, discrimination and exclusion are reproduced daily. The project offered us a unique possibility to gain knowledge about the topic and to get to know digital storytelling as a concrete method for challenging stereotypes and promoting inclusion.

Already during the preparation phase, our team explored several social challenges affecting our own communities. Through collaborative discussions, research and the creation of visual storytelling posters, our participants analysed the issues of educational inclusion, mental health awareness, the integration of migrant workers, environmental justice and human rights advocacy, and reflected on how storytelling can be used as a tool to promote empathy, awareness and positive change. This preparation ensured that our participants arrived in Cyprus with a clear picture of the realities they wanted to speak about.

Our Foundation has worked with young people on social awareness and active citizenship before, but our young leaders had not yet been equipped with the practical audiovisual tools to address these topics before this project. Our Foundation has certainly benefited from taking part in the DiGiSC project, as our involved leaders became equipped with new methods and tools of working with youth on the topic: scriptwriting, filmmaking, photography, theatre-based methods and facilitated debate. The participants brought back the knowledge and the connections while gaining an unforgettable experience.

After their return, our participants implemented three local dissemination activities in Hungary. On 19 April 2026, they organised the "Eco-Connect & Detach" activity, combining environmental awareness, digital wellbeing and storytelling circles with an open discussion about Erasmus+ opportunities. On 25 May 2026, they held an interactive dissemination workshop, where the participants took part in a practical activity adapted directly from the youth exchange and debated the role of emotions in digital storytelling. On 12 July 2026, they organised an open-air Erasmus+ workshop, combining non-formal education activities with discussions on identity, diversity and visual communication.

We are grateful to the hosting organisation, Acpelia, for the professional implementation of the mobility, and we look forward to further cooperation in projects of this kind.


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
